John 16:1-33

- A. Recognizing the Conflict [15:18-21]
- B. Resisting False Expectations [15:22-25/16:1-4a]

John 15:25 But the word that is written in their Law must be fulfilled: They hated me without a cause.'

Psalm 69:4 More in number than the hairs of my head are those who hate me without cause; mighty are those who would destroy me those who attack me with lies.

C. Observing the Holy Spirit's Work. [15:26f; 16:4b-15]

Romans 8:16-17 The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, 17 and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

D. Engaging the Journey [16:16-33]

Don't get frustrated when you are confused or don't understand what Jesus is doing in your life. In these verses, we see that Jesus' lead disciples were confused, and Jesus was standing and sharing right in front of them! In these intersections of life is where we choose to cut and run or pursue him in the middle of our confusion.

Discussion Questions/Prayer

[1] Read John 15:18-25. What are specific ways we can live as "not of the world"? How have you experienced persecution or trouble as a disciple of Jesus? [LCSB]

[2] Read John 16:1-4. What do you expect from God? Do your expectations align with God's promises in the Scriptures? Find some specific promises He has made to us in his word. [ABIDE]

[3] Read John 16:12-15. What did Jesus teach about the Holy Spirit in these verses? What did Jesus teach about himself in these verses? [LCSB]

[4] Read John 16:23-24. Choose in this moment to take Jesus at his word. Identify different areas of need in your life, and then spend time asking the Father to meet those needs. [LCSB]

■ John 16:1-33 "I have said all these things to you to keep you from falling away. ² They will put you out of the synagogues. Indeed, the hour is coming when whoever kills you will think he is offering service to God. ³ And they will do these things because they have not known the Father, nor me. ⁴ But I have said these things to you, that when their hour comes you may remember that I told them to you.

"I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. ⁵ But now I am going to him who sent me, and none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' ⁶ But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your heart. ⁷ Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you. ⁸ And when he comes, he will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment: ⁹ concerning sin, because they do not believe in me; ¹⁰ concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father, and you will see me no longer; ¹¹ concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged.

12 "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. 13 When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. 14 He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. 15 All that the Father has is mine; therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.

¹⁶ "A little while, and you will see me no longer; and again a little while, and you will see me." 17 So some of his disciples said to one another, "What is this that he says to us, 'A little while, and you will not see me, and again a little while, and you will see me'; and, 'because I am going to the Father'?" 18 So they were saying, "What does he mean by 'a little while'? We do not know what he is talking about." 19 Jesus knew that they wanted to ask him, so he said to ■ them, "Is this what you are asking yourselves, what I meant by ■ saying, 'A little while and you will not see me, and again a little while ■ and you will see me'? ²⁰ Truly, truly, I say to you, you will weep and ■ lament, but the world will rejoice. You will be sorrowful, but your sorrow will turn into joy. 21 When a woman is giving birth, she has sorrow because her hour has come, but when she has delivered the baby, she no longer remembers the anguish, for joy that a human being has been born into the world. 22 So also you have sorrow now, but I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you. 23 In that day you will ask nothing of me. Truly, truly, I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you. 24 Until now you have asked nothing in my name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full.

25 "I have said these things to you in figures of speech. The hour is
coming when I will no longer speak to you in figures of speech but
will tell you plainly about the Father. ²⁶ In that day you will ask in my
name, and I do not say to you that I will ask the Father on your
behalf; ²⁷ for the Father himself loves you, because you have loved me
and have believed that I came from God. ²⁸ I came from the Father
and have come into the world, and now I am leaving the world and
going to the Father."

²⁹ His disciples said, "Ah, now you are speaking plainly and not using figurative speech! ³⁰ Now we know that you know all things and do not need anyone to question you; this is why we believe that you came from God." ³¹ Jesus answered them, "Do you now believe? ³² Behold, the hour is coming, indeed it has come, when you will be scattered, each to his own home, and will leave me alone. Yet I am not alone, for the Father is with me. ³³ I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world."
