3. The Call to Anticipate Clarity

2 Timothy 3:1-9

- But **understand** this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty.
- ² <u>For</u> people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy,
- ³ heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good,
- 4 treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God,
- ⁵ having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. **Avoid** such people.
- ⁶ For among them are those who creep into households and capture weak women, burdened with sins and led astray by various passions,
- ⁷ always learning and never able to arrive at a knowledge of the truth.
- ⁸ Just as Jannes and Jambres opposed Moses, so these men also oppose the truth, men corrupted in mind and disqualified regarding the faith.
- ⁹ But they will not get very far, <u>for</u> their folly will be plain to all, as was that of those two men.

Discussion Questions

- 1. Look through the letter of 2 Timothy as a whole. Where else in it has Paul warned Timothy about times of difficulty?
- 2. What is the difficulty being considered in this (2 Timothy 3) passage? Why do you think it is important that Timothy and subsequent church leaders know about it?
- 3. What are the characteristics that Paul gives of a counterfeit Christian? Which verses refer to disordered loves? What does this mean about life in the church?
- 4. Look back at the two imperatives (bolded above) in the passage (γίνωσκε "know!", ἀποτρέπου "turn away!"). How would these be applicable today?
- 5. What about this passage <u>comforts</u> you if you are disturbed? What about it <u>disturbs</u> you if you are comfortable?
