and his courts with praise!
Give thanks to him; bless his name!

and his faithfulness to all generations.

Study Questions and Prayer

- [1] Read Psalm 100. When was the last time you intentionally thanked God for something? What was it?
- [2] What are some ways we are tempted to make worship more about yourself than about God?
- [3] Tim Keller often compares a relationship with God to a covenant rather than a transaction. Do you ever slip into treating God transactionally? If so, what does that look like in your life?
- [4] Jesus calls Himself the Good Shepherd who lays down His Life for His sheep (John 10) What does that teach us about His commitment to us and how should that impact our worship of Him?
- [5] In what ways is your heart prone to wander? In other words, where are you tempted to remove God from the throne of your life, and what are you most tempted to place there instead?
- [6] Read Psalm 110:5. How have you seen God's faithfulness in your own life? How might regularly remembering His faithfulness help "bind your heart" more closely to Him?
- [7] Pray: Spend some time thanking God for his faithfulness in your life and then spend some time asking God to help you bless his name in all you do.
